2012/13 ANNUAL REVIEW OF THE NHS BORDERS CODE OF CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

Aim

The purpose of this paper is to provide a summary of issues the raised by the steering group tasked to complete the annual review of the NHS Borders Code of Corporate Governance (CoCG).

Background

The NHS Borders Code of Corporate Governance was reviewed and approved by the NHS Borders Board in January 2012.

An annual review cycle was agreed by the NHS Borders Board to ensure the document remains 'fit for purpose'.

The CoCG Steering Group was set up to discuss issues raised by the officers of the organisation and to make recommendations on updates and amendments necessary on the content of the Code.

Issues raised have been detailed in the following table headed as either Governance or Operational.
