EDINBURGH, THE LOTHIANS AND SCOTTISH BORDERS MULTI-AGENCY PUBLIC PROTECTION (MAPPA) SELF-EVALUATION

Aim

To provide the Board with information on the pending Self-Evaluation of Edinburgh, the Lothians and Scottish Borders Multi-Agency Public Protection (MAPPA).

Background

MAPPA is a working partnership between agencies involved in managing registered sex offenders.

MAPPA is embedded into the everyday practice of agencies that are responsible for public protection.

Evelyn Rodger, Director of Nursing and Midwifery, is the Executive Lead for NHS Borders on the MAPPA Strategic Oversight Group. The Associate Director of Nursing (Mental Health and Learning Disabilities) is the Operational Lead for NHS Borders.

Summary

Edinburgh, the Lothians and Scottish Borders Multi-Agency Public Protection Arrangements (MAPPA) are to commence a self-evaluation, which will take a year to report out. It will begin with self-evaluation questionnaires for each regional Strategic Oversight Group to complete in mid-January 2015.

It has been proposed that a Sub-Group be created of a service manager, or equivalent, of each local authority, a representative from NHS Lothian and NHS Borders and one or two representatives from Police Scotland. Evelyn Rodger, Director of Nursing and Midwifery, has agreed to be NHS Borders representative in this Group. They will be tasked with producing a draft self-evaluation for the consideration of the Scottish Borders Strategic Oversight Group.

A paper has already been submitted to the Clinical Executive Operational Meeting held on 27 November 2014 for noting.
