CAPITAL PLAN UPDATE

Aim

This paper provides an update to the NHS Borders Board on the capital plan for 2015/16 and the indicative commitments for 2016/17 – 2020/21. The Board remains on course to achieve its Capital Resource Limit in 2015/16 and is working on developing a capital plan for 2016/17 and an outline plan for the following four years.

Background

The Board submits as part of its annual Local Delivery Plan a 5 year Capital and Infrastructure Plan.

Capital governance is delivered for the Board by the Capital Planning Group (CPG) and the Capital Management Team (CMT). The CPG makes recommendation through the Clinical Executive Strategy Group for consideration and agreement of the Board on the prioritised 5 year capital plan. The CPG remits delivery of the in year capital plan to the CMT.

Capital Plan 2015/16

Capital Resources

The table below details the capital resources received by the Board for 2015/16 and includes updates on agreed slippage to 2016/17 for Roxburgh St (£880k), East/West Brig (£580k) and Theatre Ventilation (£685k).

NHS Borders has been working closely with Scottish Government on the management of capital resources. Slippage on three local schemes will to utilised to support the NHS Scotland capital plan. In line with delivery of the schemes resources will be recycled nationally and will supplement NHS Borders capital allocation in 2016/17.

The level of expenditure planned is in line with the revised level of resources available and therefore the Board remains on course to deliver on its capital resource limit.

Property disposals

The Board identified 2 properties which have been declared surplus and are currently held for sale (Westgrove, Melrose and Orchard Park, St Boswells). Proceeds from the sale concluded in June for Westgrove have been committed against general space utilisation works to release rented accommodation in Huntlyburn Terrace and West End, Melrose. The sale of Orchard Park is being actively pursued. A further property, 12-14 Roxburgh Street, Galashiels has been declared surplus in year and is being actively marketed for disposal during 2015/16.

Scottish Government have approved that NHS Borders can retain all property sales realised within the current financial year and can utilise those resources to deliver prioritised capital schemes.

Future years indicative Capital Plan 2016/17 - 2021/21

The attached appendix details the draft capital plan for 2016/17 and outline commitments for 2017/18 - 2020/21.

In line with new processes that are being put in place the Capital Management Team are holding stakeholder prioritisation sessions to review and score submitted capital project requests from both Clinical and Support Services. Prioritisation and scoring is made against a number of agreed criteria. The prioritised schemes will be submitted to the capital planning group and Clinical Executive Strategy Group for consideration. The process and the outcomes will be discussed at the Board development session in February before a finalised plan is recommended to the Board for approval as part of the 2016/17 5 year LDP Capital Plan.

Property and Asset Management Strategy (PAMS) 2016

An outline timetable for the production of the NHS Borders PAMS 2016 document has been produced and this will be taken forward over the coming months. This will be an update to the previous strategy and detail what has been achieved in the last year as well as identifying where the board is now, where it wants to be in 10 years time and an outline on how this will be achieved in areas relating to property and assets. A development

session has been arranged in January to discuss the shape and direction of the PAMS 2016. The session will also share Scottish Government feedback on PAMS 2015.

Summary

The Board has agreed the 5 year Capital Plan as part of the submission to Scottish Government of the Local Delivery Plan.

An update on delivery of the current year capital plan has been provided. The Board remains on course to achieve its capital resource limit for 2015/16.

Work is ongoing to develop the capital plan for 20161/7 and the four next years. For the longer term a session will take place to January to discuss the Board's strategy for its property and assets.
