

Freedom of Information request 156-17

Request

I request under HM Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 the following information:

On the 31/8/2015 it was disclosed to me by the mental welfare commission that the following transmission by the MWC was made:

" Colin/Alison

I have just spoke to David Powell. ASP co-ordinator in Borders. Brian says this person is well known to Police in Borders and has heard them discussed at meetings. He plans to speak to his colleagues in Adult Community Care Team, the nursing team and Police with view to proceeding with this. "

I am assuming this male "Brian" is maybe an employee of the nursing team of NHS Borders if not please state so. If I have made a similar request please state and show so and I will withdraw this request.

A support worker from a woman's crisis agency has now been assigned to me. For her information I would request under the act, a full disclosure of the full name of this male "Brian" and a disclosure of the position of work within the NHS Borders that he holds. Please also disclose a full description and the nature of this "nursing team" that maybe at NHS Borders.

If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled or the decision given, you may ask NHS Borders to review its actions and the decision. The request for a review should include your name and address for correspondence, the request for information to which the request relates and the issue which you wish to be reviewed. Please state the reference number **156-17** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
