- 3. The annual rent paid by your board to such owners, as a total and divided by premises
- 4. The length of time for which your health board rented each property

- 1. .The Board does rents premises at:
 - Huntlyburn Terrace, BGH which are used as residences for example for Medical Staff on rotation to NHS Borders and staff on call who require to be on BGH site.
 - The Recreation Area which is an Occupational Therapy area.
- 2. The owner of these properties is Eildon Housing Association.
- 3. Annual rental for both properties during 2016/17 was:

4. Both the properties have been leased by the Board since 2002.

The request for a review should include your name and address for correspondence, the request for information to which the request relates and the issue which you wish to be reviewed. Please state the reference number 348-17 on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
