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## Freedom of Information request 369-17

## Request

Under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 I would like to request the following:

The number of cancer patients who have had to travel to another health board area for treatment in the last three years.

Please include the health board they are/were required to travel to, and the reason - for example, to undergo radiotherapy.

Could this please include the most up to date figures, and a year-by-year breakdown of the required time frame.

## Response

NHS Borders aims to provide patient care within local services. Where necessary NHS Borders also commission's cancer services from NHS Lothian as the main provider of care through various Service Level Agreements in place. The number of patients treated in NHS Lothian is not identifiable for each year requested from the data received from NHS Lothian. Therefore the patients identified in table 1 below shows the volume of patient contacts and not the number of patients.

On occasion patients may need to receive cancer treatment from other NHS providers in both Scotland & England and the volume of these patient contacts is detailed in the table 2.

In exceptional circumstances patients may need to receive cancer treatment from another provider outwith NHS Scotland. A manual trawl of invoices received for patients treated under Extra Contractual Referrals would be required but the cost of carrying out this work would be outwith the parameters of FOI legislation. Therefore under Section 12 of the FOI(S) we are not required to provide this information.

The request for a review should include your name and address for correspondence, the request for information to which the request relates and the issue which you wish to be reviewed. Please state the reference number **369-17** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
