## Introduction

The Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA) was introduced in January 2005. The Act requires all public authorities in Scotland to make any information they hold available on request.

The information requested reflects the issues of interest to the press and the public, such as the cost of prescribing methadone, overseas doctors working in Scotland, redundancy payments and staff bonuses.

During this year, there has only been a small increase in the volume of requests and the media remain the most active applicants. A full list of all the requests made to NHS Borders in 2011/12 will be published with this report on the NHS Borders website.

The FOI(S)A protocol is reviewed annually to ensure issues are addressed and to take account of developments in the FOI(S)A system.

Processes and activity are monitored through quarterly reports to the Information Governance Committee. The operational lead for the process maintains close links with other aspects of information governance through membership of the Committee and working as part of the Information Governance Team. The Information Governance Committee reports to the NHS Borders Audit Committee.

## 1 Activity

The volume of FOI requests has only risen by 4% on the previous year. However, this is part of a 189% increase over the last five years. Requests from the media continue to account for the highest volume of work at 35% with those from the Scottish Parliament accounting for 19%, the latter having decreased on last years increase during the election. Requests from the commercial sector show a steady rise while the other categories have remained relatively stable.

## 2 Response times

The Act requires that all requests are responded to within 20 working days.

During the year 2011/12, 34 applicants did not receive a response within the 20 working day timescale. There have been issues with compliance which has dropped significantly in the last two years. However, this should be viewed against the increase in activity and the complexity of requests now being received.

We continue to actively monitor and take action to ensure breaches are kept to a minimum and support departments to respond to requests within the required timescale. Wherever possible, the applicant is informed in advance of any likely delay and this has helped to ensure that no action is taken by the applicant when a response has been delayed.

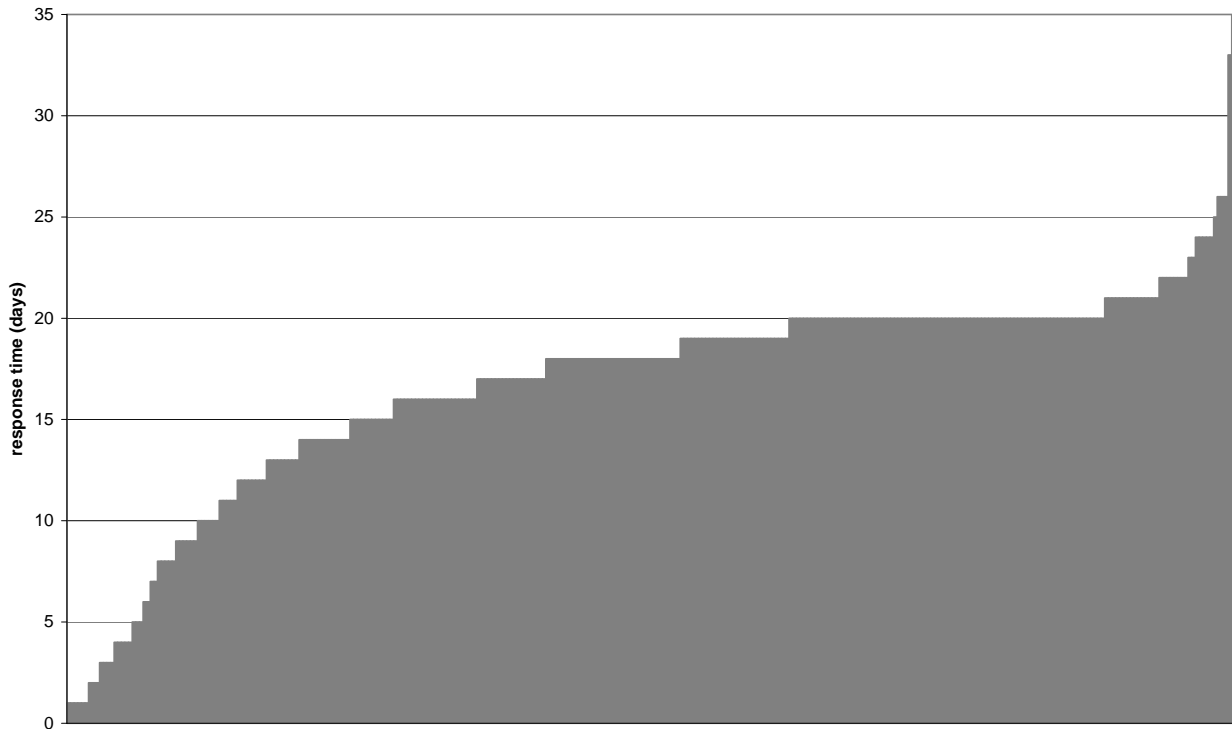
During the year, we have worked with departments to improve on this performance and an improvement was beginning to be seen at the end of the last quarter of 2011/12.

#### 4 Performance monitoring

The majority of applicants (86%) receive all or part of the information they have requested. The cost of providing the information (excessive cost of compliance) is the most frequent reason for withholding information.

## **5 Reviews & appeals**

Applicants who are unhappy with the response they receive or the way in which the response was handled may ask for a review of their request. If they remain dissatisfied, they may appeal to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner.

In 2011/12 we received one request for an internal review.

The original request was for a range of details of IT and mobile phone contracts. In our response, we withheld the information on the basis that there was no central data bank for this information and a trawl of systems and paperwork would be required. The applicant challenged this and requested a review.

Following discussion with the service which holds the information, it was agreed that the information would be collated and released. For this reason, a formal internal review was not held.

There were no reviews referred to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner for investigation in the year 2011/12.

## **6 Assessment of the cost of responding to requests**

Concerns are often raised about the cost of responding to FOI(S)A requests. In 2011/12, the NHS Borders Audit Committee requested an assessment of the cost and this was supported by the Efficiency Board with a view to determining whether the Board should charge for responding to FOI(S)A requests.

The Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOI(S)A) allows public authorities to make a charge for providing information requested under the conditions of the Act. However, unlike the Data Protection Act 1998 which sets a prescribed fee for Subject Access Requests, or Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 which allows each body to set their own charging regime, FOI(S)A includes Fees Regulations which set parameters for charging and a costing framework. When FOI(S)A was first implemented, all the NHS Scotland Boards agreed not to charge for responses. This was in part because of the extra work required to put a charging scheme in place.

For the assessment of cost, data was collected from the services responding to FOI(S)A requests over a three month period to indicate the time taken to collate the information and the grade of staff involved. This allowed a calculation to be made using the FOI(S)A Fees Regulations.

Out of 56 responses, only one met the criteria for charging and the amount which could be recovered would not cover the cost of raising an invoice.

Consideration was also given to the additional work which would be required by the services to provide costing information, along with the potential for a rise in complaints and the lack of consistency with other

Boards. Both the Audit Committee and the Efficiency Board agreed that charging for FOI(S)A responses would not bring any benefits.
