Request

Please see below a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. I look forward to hearing from you shortly, please let me know if you have any queries.

Of those medically qualified staff (excluding dentists and GPs) directly employed by your board:

- i. How many are earning below £36,500 and what is their average age
- ii. How many are earning between £36,500 and £80,000 and what is their average age
- iii. How many are earning £80-£85,000 and what is their average age
- iv. How many are earning £85-£90,000 and what is their average age
- v. How many are earning £90-£95,000 and what is their average age
- vi. How many are earning £95-£100,000 and what is their average age
- vii. How many are earning more than £100,000 and what is their average age

All figures should be based on WTE basic pay.

Please state the reference number **313-19** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
