1. The table below details the spend on private taxis between 2016/17 and 2018/19:

2. NHS Borders uses taxis for a variety of reasons. This can include patient transport, transfer of equipment, urgent transportation of laboratory samples, x-rays from radiology and patient case notes. The information contained on the invoices from taxi companies does not distinguish the reason for transportation. Therefore under Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 this information is not held.

If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled or the decision given, you may ask NHS Borders to review its actions and the decision. Please state the reference number **131-20** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
