When you present your battery book to request new batteries at your local Health Centre and hand in your old batteries please remove them from their original packaging as we aim to recycle all battery returns.

Please note we can also send batteries to your home address via Royal Mail; please send the yellow battery book with any request.

If you have 1 hearing aid two packets of batteries will be issued, if you have 2 hearing aids then four packets will be issued.

Hearing Aid Retubing

Your hearing aid(s) should be retubed every 6 months, or when the tubing starts to degrade.

Some patients prefer to retube their own hearing aids, especially slim tube aids where tubing can be sent out if required (please contact the department for this). However, we do provide a retubing service. This can either be done by arranging an appointment at the department (using the contact details below) or by attending a volunteer lead drop in clinic.

Outreach retubing clinics, run by volunteers, operate in six locations:
