

Update on alcohol and drugs services in Borders September 2020

All drug and alcohol services in Borders are open and are able to see new and current clients via telephone or face to face where appropriate. Services are observing social distancing measures and minimising face to face contact for the safety of our staff and people in receipt of services.

LOCAL SUPPORT SERVICES

Borders Addiction Service. Chimes and We Are With You continue to take new referrals.

We Are With You (formerly Addaction)

WAWY has launched a click and collect service and premises in Galashiels are open from 11 – 3pm daily for collection of IEP and Naloxone. The service is also delivering IEP and naloxone to those who can't access equipment, where it's safe to do so.

WAWY continues to offer a range of online groups 3 times a week as well as a WhatsApp recovery group and responding to the needs of clients daily with some walk and talk, door step visits as well as drop in using PPE and social distancing guidelines.

The service is using a combination of telephone, online and face to face for those at high risk with appropriate safety measures in place.

- Webchat : Everyday 10am 4pm
- MAP Groups The online MAP is the same as the physical MAP but has expanded to include impact of lockdown on recovery, drug and alcohol related discussion and wider recovery activities for example quizzes and relaxation sessions. Online groups for Mutual Aid Partnerships takes place on Mon, Wed and Friday 12pm – 2pm.

Borders Addiction Service

BAS are operating in a flexible way according to need: home (using PPE), door step and clinic visits are available. Staff in both BAS and We are With you have also offered face to face 'therapeutic' meetings e.g. walks, meeting in socially distanced public spaces which has been helpful for particularly isolated people.

BAS are able to manage and assess people on to OST and have been able to re-introduce daily supervision for those that require this.
