<b>COVID-19 REMOBILISATION PLAN 2021/22 – NHS BORDERS BOARD RATIFICATION OF FORMAL APPROVAL BY RESOURCES &amp; PERFORMANCE COMMITTEE</b>	
<b>Purpose of Report:</b>	
The purpose of this report is to ask Board members to ratify the Resource & Performance Committee's formal approval of NHS Borders COVID-19 Remobilisation Plan 2021/22 (RMP3).	
<b>Recommendations:</b>	
The Board is asked to <b>ratify</b> the approval.	
<b>Approval Pathways:</b>	
The draft RMP3 plan was developed in conjunction with service leads, reviewed by the Board Executive Team and then approved by the Chair and Chief Executive for submission. The submitted version has been shared for review and comment with the Area Partnership Forum, Area Clinical Forum, Recovery Planning Group, members of the IJB and members of NHS Borders Board for an opportunity to review and comment. No substantive feedback was received once the plan was circulated for comment, so the plan remained per the draft which was submitted to Scottish Government in February. At the April Board Meeting the Board delegated responsibility for approving the remobilisation plan to the Resources & Performance Committee. The plan was subsequently presented to Committee on 6 <sup>th</sup> May 2021 and it was approved. This cover paper was reviewed and approved by the Director of Planning & Performance.	
<b>Executive Summary:</b>	
<p>1.1 On the 6<sup>th</sup> May 2021 RMP3 was taken to the Resources and Performance Committee for formal sign off on behalf of NHS Borders Board.
