Freedom of Information request 172-21

Request

I am making a FOI request for the following information relative to patient/carer information and guidance and incidents of deep vein thrombosis and subsequent pulmonary embolism following surgery.

- 1. Post-operative guidance and information for patients/carers with particular information on VTE prevention after undergoing orthopaedic surgery and which would have been given as part of the discharge process for the years 2010, 2015 and 2020. Please provide copies of any such guidance/information for the relevant years.
- 2. How many patients returned with suspected deep vein thrombosis within 90 days of discharge following orthopaedic surgery for the years 2010, 2015 and 2020?
- 3. How many patients returned with suspected deep vein thrombosis with 90 days of discharge following all surgery for the years 2010, 2015 and 2020?
- 4. How many patients died from deep vein thrombosis/pulmonary embolism within 90 days of discharge following orthopaedic surgery for the years 2010, 2015 and 2020?
- 5. How many patients died from deep vein thrombosis/pulmonary embolism within 90 days of discharge following all surgery for the years 2010, 2015 and 2020?

Response

 Orthopaedic patients who are discharged on extended VTE prophylaxis receive the standard Dalteparin booklet and nursing staff instruct patients on self injection; with the move to prophylactic apixaban patients receive an information booklet and are counselled on apixaban pre-discharge. Please state the reference number 172-21 on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
