

Freedom of Information request 189-21

Request

I am writing to request information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. In order to assist you with this request, I am outlining my query as specifically as possible.

I would like to have information pertaining to:

- a) How many pharmacists the Health Board provided to cover community pharmacies claiming they could not find a locum and on what dates the cover was provided between 1st March 2021 and 19th May 2021.
- b) How many pharmacies informed the Health Board that they would not be opening their pharmacy due to a lack of locums and on what dates between 1st March 2021 and 19th May 2021.
- c) What are the names and locations for the pharmacies which informed the Health Board that they would not be opening due to a lack of locums between 1st March 2021 and 19th May 2021.

Response

- a) There were no pharmacists provided to cover community pharmacies between 1 March 2021 and 19 May 2021.
- b) No pharmacies informed NHS Borders they would not be opening their pharmacy due to a lack of locums between 1 March 2021 and 19 May 2021.
- c) Not applicable as there were no pharmacies which were unable to open due to lack of locum between 1 March 2021 and 19 May 2021.

If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled or the decision given, you may ask NHS Borders to review its actions and the decision. The request for a review should include your name and address for correspondence, the request for information to which the request relates and the issue which you wish to be reviewed. Please state the reference number **189-21** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
