

# Comprehension understanding three words

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Your child is now beginning to understand longer sentences. These are ideas to develop understanding **three** key words in a sentence. (e.g. **Tom's coat** is over there on the **peg**).

- List three things for your child to give you, from a small selection e.g. "give me the **towel**, **soap** and **brush**."
- Remember not to give your child extra clues by pointing or looking directly at the objects you want, as this will mean that they do not have to understand the words alone.
- If your child gets stuck (or only remembers some of the list) repeat all **three** things again.

You should try this in the following games or activities:

#### 1. Shopping game

- Collect objects/food for a pretend shop.
- Ask your child to go and "buy **three** things."
- Take it in turns.

### 2. Puzzles

• When doing a puzzle tell your child which **three** pieces to take out or put back.

### 3. Running game

- Put toys round the room.
- Tell your child which **three** to go and fetch.

### 4. Colouring

- Tell your child to colour **three** things e.g. the man's **nose, eyes** and **leg**.
- Take it in turns to do the colouring.


### 5. Posting

- Cut a hole in a cardboard box to make a post box.
- Take it in turns to tell each other **to** post **three** pictures or small objects through the hole.

You can also practice this during everyday activities

- Putting washing in the machine
- Putting shopping away
- Tell your child which **three** things to give you.





6. Use pictures that include different people (e.g. man, girl, lady), doing similar things (e.g. wash, brush, etc.) with different objects

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- Man washing car
- Girl washing car
- Man washing cups
- Girl driving car


Tell each other which picture to colour, cut or post through a hole in the box.

- 7. Play a 'Simon says' type game telling each other what to do: e.g. run/hop to the big chair/little table.
- 8. Using a teddy and doll and a cloth and a brush, take it in turns to tell each other to:
  - Wash teddy's ear
  - Wash dolly's hand
  - Brush teddy's feet
- 9. When sorting out the washing tell your child to:
  - 'Put Helen's sock in the basket'
  - 'Put mummy's skirt on the table'
- **10.** Using objects or toys tell your child to:
  - 'Give the apple and banana to Tom'
  - 'Give a **book** and a **car** to **Sarah**'

### 11. Big and little

Collect a big and a little teddy and dolly, a brush, a sponge and a towel. Ask your child to:

- 'Wash the little dolly'
- 'Brush the big teddy'
- 'Dry the big dolly'



### 12. Colours

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Collect different coloured car, trucks etc and a selection of toy people. Ask your child to put the people in different places e.g.

- 'Put the **boy** in the **red car**'
- 'Put the lady in the blue van'

## 13. P.E. game

Equipment- Big and little ball Big and little bean bag Big and little hoop Big and little balloon (strong ones) Large cardboard box to put on its side with opening towards you like a goal.

### Game:

To get the object in the box. Ask your child to do different things e.g.

- 'Throw the big ball (in the box)'
- 'Kick the little bean bag'
- 'Roll the big balloon' etc

In the box is understood, so you don't need to say this. Then your child can tell you what to do.

### 14. Person, action and place

Choose 2 or 3 soft toys or play-people. Tell the child which toy should move and where it should go e.g.

- 'Make teddy jump on the table'
- 'Make rabbit sleep on the mat'
- 'Make the boy sit on the bed'
