- 2. As a general hospital NHS Borders does not perform bariatric surgery within local facilities. Patients requiring this treatment are sent to other NHS boards or in some cases where necessary into private providers, treatment requests can be made through the Extra Contractual Referral route. NHS Borders do not hold waiting times information for this procedure as the waiting times would fall under the provider of care delivering the surgical procedure. Therefore under Section 17 of the FOI(S)A 2002 this data is not held.
- As per response to the first question NHS Borders does not perform bariatric surgery within local facilities, therefore NHS Borders does not hold waiting times data for bariatric surgery. Therefore under Section 17 of the FOI(S)A 2002 this data is not held.
- 4. The reporting system in place does not identify the numbers of patients being seen or the reasons to be seen within the Specialist Weight Management Team for post procedure complications from home or overseas treatment. Patients may also be seen by other healthcare professionals such as their GP if complications arise with no way knowing if the data is held or that the health board could access this information. Therefore under Section 17 of the FOI(S)A 2002 this data is not held.

If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled or the decision given, you may ask NHS Borders to review its actions and the decision. If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
