- 4. How much over time was worked by employees in ward based and traditional community mental health services between a) April 2017-April 2018 and b) April 2021-April 2022.
- 5. How many people were employed in ward based and traditional community mental health services in a) April 2017 and b) April 2022

- 3. There were 8 people in posts under Action 15 by April 2022.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal

review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
