NHS Borders Public Protection e-learning module- mandatory for all NHSB staff to complete (Aug 2022 74% compliance). Includes section on Domestic Abuse. Completed 2 yearly basis

Introduction to Public Protection (teams) – General workforce

Includes section on domestic abuse. Complete every 3 years

Learning outcomes

- Understand what is meant by harm, abuse and neglect
- Understand your responsibility to Recognise, Respond, Record and Report concerns about children and adults.

Thinking about risk (teams)- Specific workforce

Includes section on Domestic Abuse. Complete every 3 years

Learning Outcomes

- Understand some of the factors influencing our perception of risk
- Understand some of the factors that may contribute to increased risk of harm
- Have a working knowledge of the 3 stage model of working with risk: Assess, Analyse, Manage

NHS Borders also access external training on domestic and childhood sexual abuse through Scottish Borders Violence against Women (VAWG) but this has not taken place for a number of years.

Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
