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## Freedom of Information request 479-22

## Request

- 1. In the financial year 2020/2021 how many referrals from GP's were received for cardiac rhythm monitoring?
- 2. In the financial year 2020/2021 how many patients received ambulatory heart monitoring at more than 7days?
- 3. In the financial year 2020/2021, how many patients were monitored using ambulatory heart monitoring devices?
- 4. What percentage of the ambulatory heart monitoring reports are performed in-house?

## Response

- 1. In financial year 2020/2021, NHS Borders received 220 referrals from GP's for Cardiac Rhythm Monitoring.
- 2. In the financial year 2020/2021, 59 NHS Borders patients received Ambulatory Heart Monitoring for more than 7days.
- 3. In the financial year 2020/2021,1041 NHS Borders patients were monitored using Ambulatory Heart Monitoring devices.
- 4. All (100%) Ambulatory Heart Monitoring reports are performed in-house in NHS Borders.

Please note, this was a peak Covid-19 year and from a diagnostic perspective, referral activity during 2020/2021 was affected.

If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled or the decision given, you may ask NHS Borders to review its actions and the decision. The request for a review should include your name and address for correspondence, the request for information to which the request relates and the issue which you wish to be reviewed. Please state the reference number **479-22** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
