In the last five years can you please tell me:

- 1. The number of doctors or nurses who have reported verbal abuse (including racist slurs) from patients or by the family/friends of patients
- 2. The number of doctors or nurses who have reported physical abuse from patients or by the family/friends of patients
- 3. The number of doctors or nurses who have had property taken or vandalised by patients or by the family/friends of patients
- 4. How many incidences of abuse led to police action
- 5. The number of cases of abuse over the past five years.

Clarification Request:

- 1. Are you willing to receive the data per financial year?
- 2. Our recording methods do not distinguish between staff groups, therefore we would not be able to identify if it was a Doctor or a Nurse who made the report our data would be inclusive of all staff categories. Would you like to receive the data in this format?
- 3. For Q5 are you looking for a total of the data for questions 1 and 2 combined, or are you seeking additional information not covered in the previous questions (please provide details)?

Clarification:

- 1. Yes I am willing to receive the data per financial year
- 2. Yes that's fine I'm happy to receive data that is inclusive of all staff categories
- 3. I am looking for the total number of physical and verbal abuse tallied for each year

If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled or the decision given, you may ask NHS Borders to review its actions and the decision. The request for a review should include your name and address for correspondence, the request for information to which the request relates and the issue which you wish to be reviewed. Please state the reference number **548-22** on this request. Your request should be made within 40 working days from receipt of this letter.

If following this review, you remain dissatisfied with the outcome, you may appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner and request an investigation of your complaint. Your request to the Scottish Information Commissioner should be in writing (or other permanent form), stating your name and an address for correspondence. You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
