- 2. How much of that spend NHS board/trust's total spend on private ambulances in these years will be for the provision of patient transport?
- 3. How much of that spend is on providing emergency cover in each of the years.
- 4. How much of the spend is on Blue Light Emergency Ambulances.

Response

1. The spend on private ambulances can only be detailed from April 2012 onwards as we do not hold the information prior to that date, therefore January – March of 2012 as well as 2010 and 2011 are all not held under Section 17 of the FOI(S)A 2002:

You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
