Request

I understand the last meeting of Borders Formulary Committee was held 27th October 2021. Applications for new medicines, formulary updates and other medicines related approvals is now considered by East Regional Formulary Committee.

I require some information regarding the approval of a medicine on the NHS. The medicine is an unlicensed drug- Bevazicumb (Avastin) and i have found information regarding its approval by the BFC in 2015 for specialist use for a single patient (Cat B).

I am wanting to know that since that approval have any further approvals been made for this indication-radiation necrosis/edema. And which hospitals/trusts within Scotland made this application and had this approved.

Would i be able to get any detailed information on which hospital/trust and Doctor requested the medicine back in 2015- that was approved.

Response

NHS Borders can confirm that no further approvals have been made for this indication – radiation necrosis/oedema.

We do not hold information on any other hospitals/trusts within Scotland who have received and approved an application. Therefore under Section 17 of the FOI(S)A 2002 this data is not held.

As we have only one Acute Hospital in the Borders we can confirm this would be Borders General Hospital, Melrose who approved the drug treatment in 2015. Unfortunately we do not hold any further data around this request, therefore under Section 17 of the FOI(S)A 2002 we cannot provide the name of the Doctor as this data is not held.

You should provide the details of the request and your reasons for dissatisfaction with both the original response by NHS Borders and your reasons for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the internal review. Your application for an investigation by the Scottish Information Commissioner must be made within six months of your receipt of the response with which you are dissatisfied.
