withyou	 They can help you with your drug or alcohol use if you're aged 16 or over. They can also support other adult family members and friends Call free on 0800 028 6664
	They can provide you with advice and support to help you cut down, stop or stay off drugs or alcohol – whatever feels right for you.
	They can see you on your own, or with a friend or family member if that feels more comfortable. You can also join one of their support groups, where you'll meet other people who are going through similar challenges with drugs or alcohol.
	Give you free injecting items and test your blood for viruses
NALOXONE	Give you Naloxone kits to take home that can help you if you overdose on opiates
