The Role

The Scottish Borders Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service is seeking to recruit a second Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist to join our established Community service in a beautiful rural area with close links to one of the country's most vibrant cities, Edinburgh.

The post is for part time up to 9 PAs but we would also welcome full time or job share applicants. You will join a fellow consultant and a friendly fully-staffed CAMHS with a strong multi-disciplinary team ethos and good working relationships with other agencies.

Comprehensive Mental Health Services are provided for children and young people in the Borders. Specialist aspects of the service include an Intensive Treatment Service with good links with the Regional Inpatient Unit at the Royal Edinburgh Hospital; an Integrated Neurodevelopmental Service with specialist Autistic Spectrum Disorder diagnosis team; and a Learning Disorders Service.

Candidates must possess MRCPsych or equivalent qualification, full and specialist registration and licence to practice with the GMC having obtained, or be within 6 months of obtaining, the appropriate CCT or equivalent. The service is approved by the Royal College of Psychiatrists for both core and specialist training; medical students from Edinburgh University are attached from time to time. There are also opportunities for interested

individuals to undertake teaching at NHS Education for Scotland and the Royal Edinburgh Hospital, and participate in research as required.
